Requirements

- Recreational Skippers Ticket (RST) Application form** signed by guardian
- Eye sight test** (if you do not have your Learners Permit) for your Recreational Skippers Ticket (RST) application
- Under 18 years old Recreational Skippers Ticket disclaimer**, signed by your guardian.
